SISTER ACT

Synopsis: *Sister Act* is the feel-good musical comedy smash that has audiences jumping to their feet! This uplifting musical was nominated for five Tony Awards, including Best Musical. When disco diva, Deloris Van Cartier witnesses a murder, she is put in protective custody in the one place the cops are sure she won't be found: a convent! Disguised as a nun, she finds herself at odds with both the rigid lifestyle and the uptight Mother Superior. But using her unique disco moves and singing talent to inspire the choir, Deloris breathes new life into the church and community. Filled with powerful gospel music, fabulous dancing and a truly moving story, *Sister Act* is a sparkling tribute to the universal power of friendship.

Language: A few uses of "Jesus Christ." "Damn." "Hell." A single use of "negro" (not used in a derogatory way.) Deloris says her boots are "FM" boots.

Drugs & Alcohol: Cigarettes are used. Deloris takes the nuns to a bar.

Sex: Deloris sings at the disco: "Take me to ecstasy. ... Just take me now. Take me higher." At the start of the show, Deloris is dating a married man. In a song about the joys of being a nun, one nun mentions sexual abstinence. Curtis says he know what gets Deloris "hot." Deloris fantasizes of performing with backup singers and "gay boys."

Violence: Deloris witnesses a murder. Her "boyfriend" is a gangster with thugs who says he will kill her for becoming a witness against him.
